Episode Summary

In this episode, we talk about the early formation and structure of the Bible. This includes the initial writing of the Bible by different generations over several centuries, and the process of discernment through which the early church formed the collection that we still have today. The conversation begins to explore topics like the authority of Scripture, biblical interpretation, and the mysteries that we may never fully understand.

Definitions

immaculate conception: the miraculous process through which Mary conceived Jesus without human involvement (no hanky panky, all Holy Spirit)

metanarratives: the big picture themes that are woven throughout the narrative of the Bible **The Torah:** refers to the first five books of the Bible (Genesis, Exodus, Deuteronomy, Numbers, Leviticus) and is central to the Jewish faith (also known as the Pentateuch or the Five Books of Moses)

Let's Discuss...

- 2 Timothy 3:16 says, "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness..." What are your thoughts around "a perfect God working through imperfect humans" to create Scripture, formed through generations and multiple authors?
- · How do you understand Scripture as authoritative in your own life?
 - » If you've ever struggled with believing in the authority of the Bible, you're not alone. Why not take a deeper dive into some of the recommended resources on this topic...see if they help give better grounding to your faith.
- What does the story of Jesus's birth (the conditions into which He chose to become human, i.e. born amongst animals in a stable to two young, poor, ordinary Jews) speak to you about the heart of God? How does this reflect on how you see the Bible?
- When you consider God's willingness to partner with imperfect human beings to divinely
 inspire the writing of the Bible, how does this make you feel about His willingness to
 work through you?
- Why do you think the Bible has been a source of so much division, and even violence, throughout the centuries?
- What is the importance of biblical interpretation? How can we do our best to understand the intended meaning in the text, and not twist it to our liking?
 - » Hint: Consider the questions that Rich mentions towards the end of *The Bible 101* to get us off on the right foot.
- Do you feel confident about allowing yourself to ask any questions you might have about the Bible, big or small? Are there other believers in your life who you feel safe to do this with?
 - This may start by being willing to admit the questions to yourself, then ask God about them, then verbalize them to others. It may be scary, but God can handle them!
